
Downloading eBooks to a Mobile Device (Android or Apple)


Step 1. Download the FREE Follett Destiny Discover app from your Google/Apple app store.



Step 2. Open the app and choose Location (state) from the drop down menu and enter your school name.




Step 3. Choose Login (you may also wish to select Remember me on this device).




Step 4. Enter your school provided Google account (not enabled at all schools)

OR

your username and password provided by your school library and click the Submit button.



Step 5. Search or browse for books.




Step 6. Tap the book cover or book title for more information.

OR

Step 7. Tap the Checkout/Hold button. If the title is available this will checkout the title to you – if the school's copies are checked out, you will be placed on the waiting list for the next copy.

Step 8. Tap the Open button to begin reading immediately (if the book is not checked out by someone else).



Step 9. Once the book is open, download it to your device by clicking the cloud icon. If you haven't checked the book out at this point, downloading will automatically check it out to you.

Step 10. Turn pages by swiping left or right.






